ATI CALABARZON to Stage...

TRECE MARTIRES CITY, Cavite—The Department of Agriculture—Agricultural Training Institute (DA-ATI) CALABARZON will stage two major events that will champion the innovative and empowering coconut industry this November 2025—the 2025 Coco Fiesta and the annual Techno Gabay Program (TGP) Summit.

Coco Fiesta 2025

The Coco Fiesta 2025 will take place on November 18-22, 2025, at the third level of SM City Trece Martires, Cavite. Anchored on the theme “Transforming Communities, Advancing Sustainability: Toward a Modernized Coconut Agriculture and Agribusiness Sector,” this fiveday event aims to provide a platform for local exhibitors and innovators to market coconutbased products, technologies, and services—thereby expanding market access and income opportunities. It also seeks to empower farmers, cooperatives, and the public on emerging innovations and value-adding endeavors related to the coconut industry development.

This celebration will feature exhibitor booths showcasing coconut-based products, technologies, and services from smallholder coconut farmers and associations across CALABARZON, alongside a technology forum with over 50 participants per session. Topics to be discussed include homemade coconut value addition for health and hygiene, innovative uses of coconut waste for handicrafts, processing of functional coco-based food products, food safety and quality standards in coconut processing, packaging and branding for coconut products, sustainable coconut agribusiness models, opportunities in coconut agritourism, and integrating coconut-based urban gardening to foster green skills and sustainability.

TGP Summit 2025

Simultaneously, the DA-ATI CALABARZON, as the lead agency for the TGP, in partnership with the Cavite State University (CvSU), the Provincial Government of Cavite, and the Southern Tagalog Agriculture, Aquatic, and Resources Research Development and Extension Consortium (STAARRDEC) will spearhead the TGP

Summit 2025 on November 19-21, 2025, at CvSU, Indang, Cavite.

The TGP Summit will gather implementers from across the region to strengthen collaboration, exchange best practices, and recognize outstanding contributions to the program. Guided by the principles of the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs)—particularly SDG 1 (No Poverty), SDG 2 (Zero Hunger), SDG 8 (Decent Work and Economic Growth), SDG 12 (Responsible Consumption and Production), and SDG 17 (Partnerships for the Goals)—the Summit will emphasize inclusive and sustainable agricultural transformation through innovation and multi-sectoral partnerships.

It also aims to recognize the achievements of Farmers’ Information and Technology Services (FITS) Centers and Magsasaka Siyentista who have embraced agricultural technologies, digital innovations, and farmer-led extension systems. By bringing together key stakeholders and promoting collaboration, the summit strengthens the capacity of local actors to respond to current challenges and contribute to the long-term goal of a resilient, inclusive, and modern coconut industry.

Gracing the program are anticipated guests from various implementing agencies of the Coconut Farmers and Industry Development Plan (CFIDP) and Mr. Apl.De.Ap, international artist and founder of the Apl.De.Ap Foundation, who recently launched his project to plant 100 million coconut trees—symbolizing a united front for sustainable coconut industry growth.

MPTC GEARS UP FOR UNDAS 2025

Enhanced traffic management, shoulder lane regrading, and motorist assistance set across MPTC expressways Metro Pacific Tollways Corporation (MPTC) is reactivating its “Biyaheng Arangkada” Motorists Assistance Program to ensure safe and convenient travel during the Undas season. With an expected surge in traffic across NLEX, SCTEX, NLEX Connector, CALAX, CAVITEX, and CCLEX, MPTC is intensifying operations through increased personnel deployment, 24/7 traffic monitoring, and quick-response teams.

Free towing for Class 1 and Class 1M (for CCLEX) vehicles to the nearest exit will be available from 6:00 AM of October 30 to 6:00 AM of November 3 to assist motorists, while roadworks will be suspended from October 29 to November 3, except for emergency repairs, to keep traffic flowing smoothly.

To reduce bottlenecks, NLEX Corporation has regraded shoulder lanes in key areas to support counterflow operations. Motorists are advised to plan their trips ahead and avoid peak hours, particularly during the following periods:

- Afternoon of October 29
- Afternoon of October 30 to evening of October 31
- Morning of November 1
- Afternoon of November 2
- Morning until noon of November 3

Around 2,000 traffic, toll, and emergency personnel will be on duty across MPTC expressways, in coordination with the PNP, LGUs, and key agencies. At CAVITEX, “Biyaheng Arangkada” will be implemented with PEA Tollway Corporation, a subsidiary of the Philippine Reclamation Authority.

Motorists can use the MPT Drive-Hub app for real-time traffic updates, RFID reloading, and assistance. As part of the MVP Group’s efforts, Maynilad will provide free bottled water, while Smart Communications will offer free Wi-Fi and charging stations in select areas.

MPTC encourages motorists to ensure their vehicles are in good condition and RFID accounts are sufficiently loaded before traveling.

DILG cancels local execs' foreign trips amid Tino, Uwan aftermath

MANILA – The Department of the Interior and Local Government (DILG) has barred local officials of affected areas from traveling abroad to ensure smooth disaster response in the aftermath of tropical cyclones Tino and Uwan.

In a television interview on Monday, DILG Secretary Juanito Victor “Jonvic” Remulla said he has ordered all elective and appointive local officials to cancel or suspend their foreign trips from Nov. 9 to 15 to ensure their presence during pre-disaster preparations, response, and recovery operations for Super Typhoon Uwan (Fungwong).

“Those who are applying or about to leave, their travel leaves are cancelled,” he said.

Prior to that, Remulla said he also canceled the foreign travels of some 40 local officials amid the devastation caused by Typhoon Tino, which prompted President Ferdinand R. Marcos Jr. to declare a national state of calamity.

“There are some 40 travel leaves that I cancelled, so no one was able to depart for the last six days, seven days I think,” he said.

A former Cavite governor, Remulla said governors, mayors, barangay captains and other local officials must lead on the ground in accordance with Marcos’ directive and the declaration of a state of national calamity.

“We issued a sweeping memorandum that all travel leaves are cancelled,” the DILG chief said. “Hindi puwedeng makaalis ang mga tao ngayon (People can’t leave now) especially the local officials.”

Remulla reminded local leaders that under the law, they are the chairpersons of their respective Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Councils (DRRMCs) and must be physically present during all phases of disaster management, which are preparation, response, and recovery.

Local government units (LGUs) are also mandated to assist affected communities, reactivate Local Price Coordinating Councils to prevent overpricing, and coordinate with regional and provincial DRRMCs and DILG regional offices for timely and unified action.

All DILG regional directors, meanwhile, have been instructed to ensure that these are all complied with. (PNA)

NHA, NAMAHAGI NG P12.37-M AYUDA SA MGA BIKTIMA NG LINDOL SA CEBU

Mga katoto walang patlang na ipinatutupad ni National Housing Authority (NHA) Joeben A. Tai at Assistant General Manager Alvin S. Feliciano ang lahat ng mga direktiba ng ating butihing Pangulong Ferdinan R. Marcos Jr. hinggil pamamahagi ng lupa't bahay, peoples caravan, at milyong halagang tulong sa mga nasunugan kabilang na ang mga nasalanta ng bagyo, lindol at malalagim na trahedya sa buong bansang Pinas tulad ng naganap kamakailan sa Lungsod ng Cebu.

Kung saan namahagi ang National Housing Authority (NHA) ng may kabuuang P12,370,000.00 halaga ng cash aid, sa ilalim ng Emergency Housing Assistance Program (EHAP) nito, sa 1,085 pamilyang naapektuhan ng magnitude 6.9 na lindol na tumama sa munisipalidad ng San Remigio, Cebu kamakailan.

Sa ilalim ng gabay ni NHA General Manager Joeben A. Tai, pinangunahan ni Assistant General Manager Alvin S. Feliciano ang pamamahagi ng tulong pinansyal, katuwang sina Region 7 Regional Manager Engr. Hermes Jude G. Juntillo, at Cebu District Officer-in-Charge Engr. Dante U. Estrobo.

Bilang kinatawan ni GM Tai, nagpahayag ng pag-asa si AGM Feliciano na makatutulong ang financial assistance para sa pagpapabuti ng kalagayan ng mga benepisyaryo. “Bilang bahagi ng pagsunod sa direktiba ng ating Pangulong Ferdinand “Bongbong” Marcos Jr. at ni NHA General Manager Joeben A. Tai, agaran po naming inihatid ang EHAP dito sa inyong lugar upang kayo po ay matulungan. Kalakip nito ang pag-asa na maibsan ng cash assistance ang mabigat na pasanin na dulot ng nagdaang kalamidad,” wika ni AGM Feliciano.

Sa kabuuang bilang ng mga benepisyaryo, 76 na pamilya na ang mga bahay ay lubos na nasira ay nakatanggap ng tig-P30,000, na may kabuuang halaga na P2,280,000; habang 1,009 pamilya na bahagyang nasira ang mga bahay ay nakatanggap ng P10,000, na may kabuuang P10,090,000.

Ang bawat benepisyaryo ay tumanggap ng P10,000 para sa mga bahay na partially damaged at P30,000 para sa mga totally

damaged, base sa validation ng NHA 7.

Nakasama rin ng NHA sa okasyon si San Remigio Councilor Miguel Martinez, na kumatawan kay Mayor Mariano R. Martinez. Magsasagawa pa ng mga EHAP distributions ang NHA sa susunod na mga linggo para sa iba pang biktima ng lindol at bagyo.

Ang EHAP ay isa sa mga kasalukuyang programa ng NHA na nagbibigay ng tulong pinansyal sa mga pamilyang naapektuhan ng mga sakuna tulad ng bagyo, sunog, lindol at baha. Layunin nitong tulungan ang mga benepisyaryo na makapagsimulang muli sa pamamagitan ng pagsasaayos ng kanilang mga tahanan.

Samantala, kasalukuyan namang nagpapatupad ang NHA ng isang buwang moratorium sa pagbabayad ng housing loan at lease payment ngayong Oktubre para sa mga lalawigan ng Cebu at Masbate, bilang paraan ng ahensya upang maibsan ang pinansyal na pasanin na nararamdaman ng mga benepisyaryo matapos ang mga nagdaang trahedya.

‘Proven in the Philippines, Trusted by the World’: DOST charts bold course to make PH a global hub for credible technologies

The Department of Science and Technology (DOST) envisions a future where the words “Proven in the Philippines. Trusted by the World.” stand as the seal of quality for every Filipino-made innovation.

At the first-ever culmination of Inno.Venta 2025: Transforming Discoveries into Economic Impact, DOST Assistant Secretary for Technology Transfer, Communications, and Commercialization (TTCC) Napoleon K. Juanillo Jr. revealed the Department’s plan to make the Philippines a trusted home for validated and globally competitive technologies.

Central to this vision is PHI-TEST, short for the Philippine Higher Education Validation and Innovation Testbed—a pioneering collaboration between DOST and the Commission on Higher Education (CHED). It will serve as a nationwide testing and certification mechanism that ensures every Filipino innovation is not only functional but scientifically sound, ethically verified, and globally credible.

“The pursuit of credibility is really a numbers game,” Juanillo said. “If we can scientifically demonstrate, through rigorous methods and large-scale testing, that tens of thousands of users or adopters have validated a technology, then we can confidently tell investors and regulators that it works. That’s credibility.”

Under PHI-TEST, technologies developed by universities, research institutes, and even independent innovators will undergo standardized protocols and validation processes aligned with global benchmarks such as ISO, CE, JIS, and KS. Through this system, Filipino innovations can achieve certification comparable to international standards, allowing them to compete in foreign markets with greater confidence.

“When a product earns PHI-TEST certification, it won’t just say ‘Made in the Philippines,’” Juanillo emphasized. “It will proudly declare, ‘Proven in the Philippines.’”

DOST Secretary Renato U. Solidum Jr. highlighted how the country’s network of state universities and colleges (SUCs) could play a key role in this effort. “Many SUCs focus on training and extension work, but beyond that, the real finish line is commercialization,” he said. “We see them as vital partners in testing and validating technologies alongside developers. That’s the essence of PHI-TEST.”

Through the DOST–CHED partnership, PHI-TEST will mobilize the expertise and facilities of higher education institutions nationwide, creating a unified ecosystem where innovation meets accountability. This framework, Juanillo explained, could transform isolated research projects into evidence-backed technologies ready for large-scale deployment and export.

“With PHI-TEST, we are building trust at scale,” he said. “We’re turning the Philippines into a regional hub for innovation validation and certification—where

credibility becomes our most powerful export.” Once operational, PHI-TEST is expected to accelerate the adoption of Filipino technologies in high-impact industries such as health, agriculture, manufacturing, and energy. It aims to open new global market pathways for local innovations, strengthen public-private collaboration, and generate billions of pesos in commercialization revenue. In doing so, it is also expected to contribute to improving the country’s ranking in the Global Innovation Index and other international benchmarks.

Ultimately, PHI-TEST represents more than just a testing framework—it is a strategic economic enabler. By institutionalizing rigorous technology validation, the Philippines can transform homegrown R&D outputs into high-value commercial solutions, creating thousands of quality jobs and establishing the country’s credibility in the global science and technology arena.

Held at Batangas State University (The National Engineering University) from October 23 to 25, 2025, Inno.Venta 2025 served as a vibrant marketplace of ideas and innovations. The event, funded under Program PROPEL, brought together scientists, entrepreneurs, investors, and industry leaders to bridge the gap between research and commercialization. Inno.Venta also reflected DOST’s broader commitment to advancing innovation for national development—anchored on four strategic pillars: human well-being, wealth creation, wealth protection, and sustainability—embodying its unifying mantra, OneDOST4U: Solutions and Opportunities for All.
