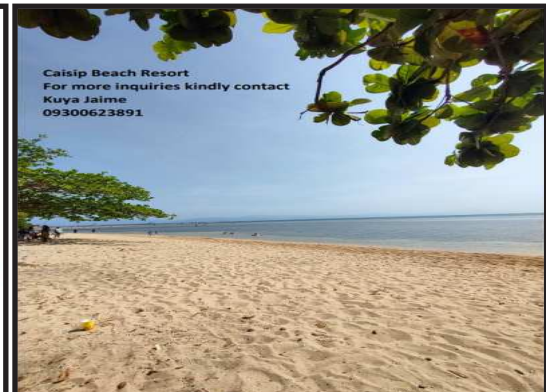

PhilHealth expands healthcare...

QUEZON CITY (PIA) — Four years after his HIV diagnosis, 32-year-old Philip, whose name has been changed in this news report to protect his privacy, struggles to consistently manage his health due to the high cost of healthcare and medication.

In an effort to address such financial barriers to accessing care, PhilHealth has nearly doubled the healthcare coverage for persons living with HIV (PLHIV), raising the annual benefit for HIV/AIDS treatment by 95 percent to P58,500 from the previous P30,000 package.

“Maganda kasi alam ko na ngayon. Makakatulong ‘to sakin para menos na sa bayad kasi minsan hindi ako nagpapa-lab at magastos,” said Philip, expressing relief over the announced increase in coverage.

(That’s great because I’m now aware. This will help me reduce my expenses since I sometimes skip lab tests because they are costly.)

PhilHealth Acting President and CEO Dr. Edwin M. Mercado assured PLHIV of the agency’s commitment to protecting their health and privacy, urging them to utilize the expanded benefits without fear or shame.

“Wala po kayong dapat ipag-alala, narito po ang PhilHealth upang tugunan ang inyong pangangailangang medikal. Kaya huwag po kayong matakot o mahiyang magpagamot. Makakaasa kayo na po-protektahan namin ang inyong mga personal na impormasyon,” said Dr. Mercado.

(You have nothing to worry about. PhilHealth is here to help meet your medical needs. That’s why you shouldn’t be scared or embarrassed to get treatment. You can rest assured that we will protect your personal information.)

The enhanced coverage package is a critical and timely measure in support of the Department of Health’s (DOH) proposal for a declaration of a national public health emergency in light of the alarming increase in human immunodeficiency virus (HIV) cases.

On Nov. 27, 2025, the health department reported over 5,500 new HIV cases between July and September 2025 alone, high-

lighting the urgent need for expanded access to testing, treatment, and comprehensive care.

The PhilHealth benefit package for HIV management covers Antiretroviral Therapy (ART) for all individuals diagnosed with HIV by certified facilities, regardless of their current clinical or immunologic status.

Moreover, it provides access to all essential services required for sustained and effective HIV care, including counseling services, consultations, and laboratory examinations, among others.

To date, there are 234 PhilHealth-accredited and DOH-designated HIV treatment hubs across the country. Dr. Mercado emphasized that confidentiality remains a top priority, assuring PLHIV that their decision to seek treatment under the benefit package will be handled with the utmost discretion by accredited healthcare providers.

With confidentiality guaranteed and financial worries significantly reduced, PhilHealth urged PLHIV and parents of children potentially living with HIV to immediately visit the nearest treatment hub to ensure they receive life-saving care.

According to the latest data from the DOH Epidemiology Bureau, the number of new HIV infections has climbed by 550% from 2010 to 2024, particularly among youth aged 15 to 24.

“Nakakabahala ang mga balita na pabata ng pabata ang mga PLHIV kung kaya’t nananawagan kami sa mga magulang ng mga kabataan, suportahan at iparamdam natin sa kanila na hindi sila nag-iisa at may kinabukasang naghihintay sa kanila sa pamamagitan ng early prevention at regular na pangangalaga sa ilalim ng ating mga YAKAP Clinics,” Dr. Mercado stressed.

(The reports that PLHIVs are getting younger are alarming, which is why we are calling on the parents of these young people, let us support them and make them feel that they are not alone and that a future awaits them through early prevention and regular care under our YAKAP Clinics.)

In a pre-observance activity for World AIDS Day happening every December 1st, the DOH and the Quezon City Government partnered on Nov. 29, 2025, to provide free HIV testing, counseling, awareness campaigns, and Human Papillomavirus (HPV) services to more than 2,000 individuals.

Aside from creating a supportive environment where every PLHIV feels safe to seek testing and treatment without fear of discrimination, the initiative also aims to ensure immediate linkage to care for those newly diagnosed and strengthen multi-sectoral collaboration to achieve the worldwide goal of eliminating AIDS as a public health threat by 2030. DTI Empowers Laguna...

The three-day activity gathered women entrepreneurs and aspiring digital sellers from across the province for a hands-on training program aimed at strengthening their digital marketing, online selling, and e-commerce capabilities. On the first day, Mr. Levy Visorde, Purplebug’s Sr. Brand Specialist, and Ms. Antonitte Jane Magsombol, SMICOS Brand Marketing Specialist, led a practical session on TikTok Shop registration, guiding participants through account creation and shop setup.

The discussion highlighted how short-form video content can help local entrepreneurs connect with broader audiences and boost sales. Participants were also introduced to CapCut, a user-friendly video editing tool that allows them to create creative, editable video posts to promote their products more effectively.

In the afternoon, Mr. Nico Toriano, Senior Business Counsellor assigned in Lumban, conducted a session on E-Marketing through Google My Business, emphasizing the value of online visibility and customer engagement. Participants were able to successfully create and verify their Google My Business profiles, allowing them to appear on Google Search and Maps—an essential step in expanding their reach and improving credibility.

The second day began with an inspirational message from DTI Laguna Provincial Director Christian Ted O. Tungohan, who underscored the need to continuously boost the knowledge of women entrepreneurs and equip them with digital skills to help them gain expanded market shares in today’s technology-driven economy.

Following this, Ms. Berlin V. Mabuna, Division Chief of the E-Commerce Policy and Promotion Division, E-Commerce Bureau, discussed key national initiatives supporting digital business growth. Her session covered the Internet Transactions Act of 2023 (ITA), DTI’s E-Commerce Philippine Trustmark, and Republic Act No. 11967, highlighting the government’s commitment to ensuring a safe, fair, and trustworthy e-commerce environment for both consumers and online sellers.

Afterward, Toriano returned to conduct a Canva workshop, where participants learned how to design posters, marketing materials, and creative layouts for their online platforms. In the afternoon, Elmar A. Salvador, Jolymar R. Ropal, Lean Kurt Razon Escano, Ed Rhovic Banaag Esmas, Angel Jentapa Bulalayao, Sarah Balmaceda Ramos, developers from Laguna University, facilitated a walkthrough of the ETAAS Mobile Application, an exclusive platform developed

for ETAAS members. The app aims to serve as a centralized e-commerce and community hub, allowing members to showcase their products and services, manage transactions, and communicate with buyers in a secure digital environment.

On the final day, Provincial Director Tungohan delivered his closing remarks, emphasizing the importance and timeliness of the ETAAS Program in helping MSMEs transition into the digital marketplace. He expressed DTI’s continued commitment to nurturing digitally capable entrepreneurs and fostering inclusive business growth in Laguna.

As part of the culmination activity, graduates of the training program received digitalization kits, which they can utilize to apply their newly acquired skills and enhance their business operations (PSMCortezano, DTI-Laguna).

Innovations in Coconut Value Addition Highlighted at ATI CALABARZON's 2025 Coco Fiesta, Techno Gabay Program Summit

The Department of Agriculture bureau, the Agricultural Training Institute (ATI) in CALABARZON, championed the innovative and empowering coconut industry on November 18-22, 2025, through the Coco Fiesta and the Techno Gabay Program (TGP) Summit.

Coco Fiesta 2025

The Coco Fiesta 2025 took place on November 18-22, 2025, at SM City Trece Martires, Cavite. Anchored on the theme “Transforming Communities, Advancing Sustainability: Toward a Modernized Coconut Agriculture and Agribusiness Sector,” this five-day event aims to provide a platform for local exhibitors and innovators to market coconut-based products, technologies, and services—thereby expanding market access and income opportunities. It also seeks to empower farmers, cooperatives, and the public on emerging innovations and value-adding endeavors related to the coconut industry development.

This celebration featured 12 booths of micro, small, and medium enterprises (MSMEs), mostly smallholder coconut farmers and associations across CALABARZON, showcasing coconut-based products, technologies, and services:

SAMAWIN Coconut Farmers Agri-cultural Cooperative (Tayabas City) Quezon Federation and Union of Cooperatives (Pagbilao, Quezon) Mang Ed Handicraft (San Pablo City) Yakap at Halik Multi-Purpose Cooperative - Quezon II (Padre Burgos, Quezon) CocoPlus Aquarian Corporation (San Pablo City) Coco Deli (Candelaria, Quezon) Ilayang Talim Agriculture Cooperative (Lucena City) Alabat Island Farmers and Producers Cooperative (Alabat, Quezon) ProSource International, Inc. (San Pablo City) Mang Larry's Original Suka at Lambanog (Liliw, Laguna) Rhudarda Multi-Purpose Cooperative (Polillo, Quezon) Magallanes Kaong Products (Magallanes, Cavite) Alongside this is a technology forum participated in by over

150 farmers from different towns in Cavite.

It was also open to mallgoers. Through resource persons from the Philippine Coconut Authority (PCA) Region IV-A, Department of Trade and Industry (DTI) - Design Center of the Philippines (DCP), and private extension partners of the ATI CALABARZON, farmers were able to learn about the homemade coconut value addition for health and hygiene, innovative uses of coconut waste for handicrafts, processing of functional coco-based food products, packaging and branding for coconut products, sustainable coconut agribusiness models, Coco Learning Site for Agriculture (LSA) as farm tourism hub, and integrating coconut-based urban gardening.

TGP Summit

Simultaneously, the ATI CALABARZON, as the lead agency for the TGP, in partnership with the Cavite State University (CvSU), the Provincial Government of Cavite, and the Southern Tagalog Agriculture, Aquatic, and Resources Research Development and Extension Consortium (STAARRDEC), spearheaded the TGP Summit on November 19-21, 2025, at CvSU, Indang, Cavite.

The TGP Summit gathered implementers from across the region to strengthen collaboration, exchange best practices, and recognize outstanding contributions to the program. It also emphasized inclusive and sustainable agricultural transformation through innovation and multi-sectoral partnerships.

During the activity, the accomplishments and invaluable contributions of Farmers' Information and Technology Services (FITS) Centers and Magsasaka Siyentista in delivering agricultural technologies, digital innovations, and farmer-led extension systems in their localities were recognized.

By bringing together key stakeholders and promoting collaboration, the summit strengthened the capacity of local actors to respond to current challenges and contribute to the long-term goal of a resilient, inclusive, and modern coconut industry.

In his message, Dr. Rolando Maningas, ATI CALABARZON Center Director, expressed gratitude to partners, exhibitors,

and coconut farmers for uniting as one to celebrate the vibrant coconut industry in the region.

“Patuloy naming ihahatid ang mga pagsasanay, teknolohiya, at oportunidad na magpapatibay sa kabuhayan at pangarap ng mga magniniyog. Ang Coco Fiesta, na sinimulan natin noong nakaraang taon sa lalawigan ng Quezon, ay isa lamang sa maraming paraan para maipamalas namin ang aming suporta, at sisiguraduhin naming mas marami pa tayong magagawa—hindi lang para sa industriya, kundi para sa bawat pamilyang umaasa sa biyaya ng niyog,” told Dr. Maningas.

He added that through these back-to-back events, the ATI CALABARZON reaffirmed its commitment to building resilient, sustainable, and forward-looking agricultural communities that thrive through innovation, collaborations, and shared purpose.

DSWD Academy expands training programs, facilities for social workers

MANILA – The Department of Social Welfare and Development (DSWD) Academy has intensified its training programs, expanded its facilities, and widened the access for the upskilling of social welfare professionals and partner institutions nationwide.

In a radio interview Saturday, DSWD Academy director Justin Cesar Batocabe said their functions have long existed within the department, but the current administration has significantly scaled up its mandate under Secretary Rex Gatchalian.

“Pinalaki po natin, gumawa po tayo ng mga pasilidad at ni-renoate din po natin ang DSWD Academy facility and sinigurado po natin mas maparami ang ating mapasa sa technical assistance and other trainings (We scaled up, built facilities and renovated the DSWD Academy to ensure that more social workers will pass the technical assistance and trainings),” Batocabe said.

The DSWD Academy operates in a department-managed learning facility in Taguig City, offering both basic and specialized courses designed for licensed social workers, local social welfare and development offices, municipal social welfare and development offices, community development workers, paraprofessionals, and social work auxiliaries.

The training programs can also serve as refresher modules for registered social workers because the curriculum includes Introduction to Social Welfare and Development, Pre-Marriage Counseling, Leadership Training for Social Workers, and House Parenting for staff in residential

care facilities.

The DSWD Academy likewise addresses specialized competency needs, particularly in disaster response and child protection.

Training programs include camp coordination and camp management, training for social workers handling Children in Conflict with the Law, and modules for court-based social workers.

Training programs are in-house, as participants usually come from other regions. They are housed in the Academy's hostel to ensure focused learning and peer support.

While the DSWD Academy currently targets local government units and government social welfare institutions, Batocabe said slots occasionally open for qualified individuals when targeted participants are unable to attend.

“These openings are publicly announced through the official DSWD Academy Facebook page and may be availed of through registration. To be qualified, applicants must have an educational or professional background aligned with social work or community development,” Batocabe said. (PNA)

Palace: Marcos hands off on House move to suspend Barzaga

MANILA – President Ferdinand R. Marcos Jr. had no involvement in, or influence over, the House of Representatives' decision to suspend Cavite Rep. Kiko Barzaga, Malacañang said Tuesday, stressing that the matter is solely within the lower chamber's jurisdiction.

Presidential Communications Office (PCO) Undersecretary and Palace Press Officer Claire Castro said the President “fully respects” the authority of the House to impose disciplinary actions on its members.

“Desisyon po iyan ng House of Representatives... So, iginagalang po ng Pangulo kung anuman ang desisyon ng House of Representatives (That is a decision of the House of Representatives, and the President respects whatever decision the House makes),” Castro told reporters in a Palace press briefing.

Barzaga earlier insinuated that his suspension was politically driven or connected to his criticisms of the administration.

Castro rejected the claim and clarified that the allegations cited against him, the supposed posting of lewd photos and disputes involving alleged disinformation about the Armed Forces of the Philippines, were unrelated to the President.

“Hindi naman po kasama ang Pangulo noong ito ay kaniyang ginawa... So, sa ating nakikita rito, ginagamit lamang ang pangalan ni Pangulong Marcos Jr. para ma-justify ang kaniyang mga ginagawang disinformation (Those did not involve the President at all.

It appears that the name of President Marcos Jr. is simply being used to justify his own actions,” she said. (PNA)
