LA TRINIDAD, Benguet (PIA) — The municipal government units in the province of Benguet sealed a partnership to strengthen disaster risk reduction through the use of science-based tools.

All the 13 municipalities of Benguet formally signed the memorandum of agreement (MOA) with the Department of Science and Technology–Philippine Institute of Volcanology and Seismology (DOST-PHIVOLCS) for the institutional adoption of GeoRiskPH during the 2026 First Semester Engagement of the Provincial Science, Technology, and Innovation Coordinating Committee of Benguet in La Trinidad on May 26, 2026.

The MOA signing signifies the shared commitment of PHIVOLCS, DOST-CAR, the provincial government of Benguet, and municipal local government units and other partners in strengthening disaster preparedness, risk assessment, and resilient communities through the use of modern tools.

The agreement supports the implementation of Republic Act 10121 or the Disaster Risk Reduction Management Act of 2010 and the RA 9729 or the Climate Change Act of 2009, promoting a proactive and scientific approach to hazards and risk

assessment.

GeoRiskPH, a multi-agency initiative led by DOST-PHIVOLCS, is one of the country's leading science-for-governance platforms. Through tools such as HazardHunterPH, GeoAnalyticsPH, GeoMapperPH, and PlanSmart Ready to Rebuild, local governments are equipped with science-based hazard assessments, risk analytics, and planning tools that support informed, life-saving decisions.

This platform is beneficial in guiding local governments to make safer, science-based decision-making where communities are highly exposed to typhoons, floods, landslides, and earthquakes.

For the DOST-PHIVOLCS, signatories are DOST-CAR Regional Director Nancy Bantog,

DOST Benguet Provincial Director Sheila Marie Claver, and PHIVOLCS Supervising Research Science Specialist Mabelline Cahulogan.

Witnessing the MOA signing are Executive Assistant Mario Baucas representing Governor Melchor Dicalas, Provincial Board Members Lady Charmaine Molintas-Likigan, who chairs the ICT and Science and Technology Committee, Jim Botiway, chairperson of the DRRM Committee, and Provincial DRRM Officer Jessie Domeris. Bantog reminded local government units that the true challenge lies not only in adopting the system but in mainstreaming its use in everyday disaster risk reduction and management operations. She emphasized the urgency of science-based disaster preparedness, citing the devastating impacts of landslides and typhoons that affected Benguet in 2025.

She stressed that GeoRiskPH provides local governments with a rigorous scientific foundation for identifying vulnerable areas and making informed decisions before disasters occur.

DOST-PHIVOLCS Director Dr. Teresito Bacolcol, in his message delivered by Cahulogan, said the MOA signing is an important milestone in

advancing risk-informed governance in Benguet.

"GeoRiskPH was built not merely as a technology platform but as a shared public digital infrastructure that connects

PH, Japan include fisheries for expanded food security ties

MANILA — The Department of Agriculture (DA) on Friday highlighted the expanded food security ties between the Philippines and Japan, which now include the fisheries sector.

The partnership is a result of an enhanced Memorandum of Cooperation (MOC) signed on the sidelines of President Ferdinand R. Marcos Jr.'s state visit to Japan on May 26-29.

In a statement, DA Secretary Francisco Tiu Laurel Jr. said the expanded partnership underscores the fisheries sector's importance to the Philippines' food security

and job creation agenda.

"Food security is not just about producing more crops," the agri chief said after he signed the MOC with Japanese Agriculture Minister Norikazu Suzuki.

"It is about building resilient food systems from farms to fishing grounds, embracing technology, and ensuring our farmers and fisherfolk can remain productive despite growing challenges," he added.

The said MOC upgrades the 2023 agriculture agreement between the two countries,

elevating the partnership beyond traditional agricultural exchanges to encompass smart farming, digital transformation, mechanization, biotechnology, climate resilience, fisheries development, value chain enhancement, and pest and disease management.

For the Philippines, the inclusion of fisheries is significant, as they contribute to the domestic food supply and employment.

Tokyo-based Agriculture Attache Aleli Maghirang, meanwhile, said the expansion will center on innovation. The new MOC also includes the promo-

tion of innovation, including smart technology and digital transformation, for improving productivity in the Philippine agriculture and food systems," she said.

It will also establish a Joint Committee on Agriculture and Fisheries (JCAF), replacing the previous agriculture-focused mechanism and creating a broader platform for policy discussions, technical cooperation, and project development.

The Philippines-Japan JCAF, meanwhile, will conduct a meeting from July 2 to 3 to immediately operationalize the MOC. (PNA)

QUEZON CITY, June 2, 2026 – The Social Security System (SSS) today begins the early rollout of the second tranche of the Pension Reform Program (PRP) to 4.1 million pensioners, advancing the originally scheduled September pension increase to provide SSS pensioners with earlier financial relief.

Finance Secretary and Social Security Commission (SSC) Chair Frederick D. Go and SSS President and Chief Executive Officer Robert Joseph M. de Claro said the agency is releasing approximately ₱6 billion in additional pension benefits from June to August 2026 to help pensioners cope with inflationary pressures and higher energy costs.

"We are releasing the second tranche of the pension increases ahead of schedule to support millions of pensioners and their families, helping them meet their daily needs and enjoy greater financial security sooner," Go said.

"With the early implementation, we hope to provide timely relief to our pensioners and their families as they continue to face every day financial

challenges," de Claro said.

He explained that SSS pensioners as of May 31, 2026, will be eligible to receive the pension hike beginning June 1, 2026, while those whose contingencies fall between June 1 and August 31, 2026, will receive their increased pension starting September 1, 2026.

Under the second tranche of the PRP, retirement and disability pensioners will receive a 10% increase in their monthly pensions, while death and survivor pensioners will receive a 5% increase.

"We recognize that rising prices and economic uncertainty continue to place pressure on Filipino families and businesses," de Claro added.

"Through the PRP, SSS ensures that our pensioners have access to timely, affordable and reliable financial support when they need it most."

The PRP is the first-ever multi-year pension increase in SSS history. Under the program, pensioners will receive annual increases in their pensions every September from 2025 to 2027.
