NOVELETA, Cavite (PIA) — The Department of Public Works and Highways (DPWH) has ordered the timely construction of the long-delayed road rehabilitation and drainage improvement projects in Noveleta, Cavite.

This follows the inspection of Secretary Vince Dizon of various projects here last July 21. The inspection focused on key infrastructure projects, including the Manila-Cavite Road

In a landmark collaboration bridging public health and social justice, the Philippine Health Insurance Corporation (PhilHealth) and the Commission on Human Rights (CHR) joined forces yesterday for a learning forum titled "Health as a Human Right: Bridging the Healthcare Divide."

The forum brought together health and social justice leaders and civil society organizations (CSOs) to reinforce a critical principle that access to quality healthcare is a fundamental human right and a core state obligation.

Discussions focused on the urgent need to shift the national healthcare paradigm away from purely treating illnesses toward robust, state-funded investment in preventive and primary healthcare.

The joint initiative aligns with global efforts by the World Health Organization (WHO) and the Office of the United Nations High Commissioner for Human Rights

(OHCHR) to mainstream human rights in health governance and Universal Health Care (UHC) implementation. By anchoring domestic healthcare delivery on a rights-based framework, PhilHealth and CHR aim to improve equitable access to care especially for the marginalized, vulnerable communities.

The forum highlighted the Yaman ng Kalusugan Program (YAKAP) as one of the government's critical programs for the progressive realization of UHC. By making primary care access points and preventive care more available, the state ensures that every Filipino is protected from financial burden due to medical emergencies.

"Healthcare is a cornerstone of human dignity," said PhilHealth President and CEO Dr. Edwin M. Mercado, who is leading the activity. "Through PhilHealth YAKAP, we are transforming our healthcare system to ensure that primary and preventive

care are accessible to every Filipino, regardless of their economic status. This is our commitment to fulfilling the promise of Universal Health Care."

CHR Commissioner Judge Maria Amifait S. Fider-Reyes (Ret.), who co-led the forum, emphasized that the right to health is inextricably linked to the dignity and right to life itself.

The Commission reiterates its commitment to working alongside PhilHealth, civil society, and all stakeholders in ensuring that the right to health is not an abstract promise but a lived reality for every Filipino.

Moving forward, PhilHealth and the CHR intend to institutionalize this partnership and deepen engagement with civil society. This sustained collaboration ensures that Filipinos are not only aware of their health rights but can fully maximize the expanded primary care benefits available under the YAKAP initiative.

4.6K officers deployed for SONA security in NorMin

CAGAYAN DE ORO CITY – The Police Regional Office in Northern Mindanao (PRO-10) has placed its entire force under heightened alert and deployed 4,688 officers ahead of President Ferdinand R. Marcos Jr.'s fifth State of the Nation Address (SONA) on Monday.

In a statement on Friday, PRO-10 Director Brig. Gen. Christopher Abrahamo said officers will be strategically deployed in key areas throughout the region to secure vital installations, transportation hubs, places of convergence, major thoroughfares and other critical locations.

They were tasked to implement appropriate security and public safety measures, while upholding the constitutional right

and placed the Regional Standby Support Force and Quick Reaction Teams on heightened readiness to respond to potential security incidents.

Quick reaction teams, medical units, and drone operators have been prepared to monitor the entire region.

Police commanders were directed to intensify visibility, conduct sustained intelligence monitoring, and coordinate closely with force multipliers and partner agencies.

They were tasked to implement appropriate security and public safety measures, while upholding the constitutional right



"While the PNP (Philippine National Police) remains steadfast in upholding every citizen's right to freedom of expression and peaceful assembly, we call on the participants to exercise these rights responsibly and within the bounds of the law," he said.

PRO-10 also activated its Civil Disturbance Management Contingent

of every Filipino to peaceful assembly and the lawful exercise of freedom of expression.

PRO-10 urged the public to remain vigilant and immediately report any suspicious activities through the unified 911 emergency hotline.

Nationwide, the PNP has deployed over 21,000 law enforcers for SONA security, with the National Capital Region Police Office placed under full alert status starting at 5 p.m. The PNP has not monitored any serious security threats ahead of the address, according to Public Information Chief Col. Allen Rae Co. (PNA)

MANILA – The Department of Labor and Employment (DOLE) is also offering free bus rides to commuters to help ease their burden due to the rising fuel and basic commodity prices.

In a statement, DOLE Secretary Francis Tolentino said the initiative is through the Libreng Sakay Program of the Department of Transportation (DOTr), which started on Monday.

He added that workers may avail of the free bus service from Lawton to the Parañaque Integrated Terminal Exchange (PITX) via Taft Avenue on weekdays, except holidays, with trips scheduled at 7:30 a.m. from Lawton to PITX and at 9 a.m. from PITX to Lawton.

At the same time, the Labor chief noted that they are exploring the possibility of expanding their transportation assistance and engaging transport groups in the future, noting the Department's previous support for the transport sector through the Tulong Panghanapbuhay sa Ating Disadvantaged/Displaced Workers (TUPAD) program.

"We will talk to the transport groups...If you remember, the DOTr gave aid to the transport sector. A large portion of it came from the DOLE. That was TUPAD," he added.

Tolentino also said that the Department is currently implementing shuttle services for DOLE employees traveling between Manila and Trece Martires, Cavite.

Another route for the free rides in Marikina and Cainta, Rizal, has already been signed, he added. (PNA)

In line with that, Better Rivers PH launched its first cleanup effort in the Visayas last month, deploying dredging teams tasked to remove waste and silt from a four-kilometer section of the Butuanon River in Mandaue City, Cebu that has restricted water flow to the Mactan Channel.

Meanwhile, rehabilitation work remains in the Parañaque, Las Piñas, Alabang, Tabang, and Tanza river systems, with the overall progress of the river cleanup initiative reaching 201.27 km of river channels and 9.3 million metric tons of waste and silt removed over the last six years./PR
