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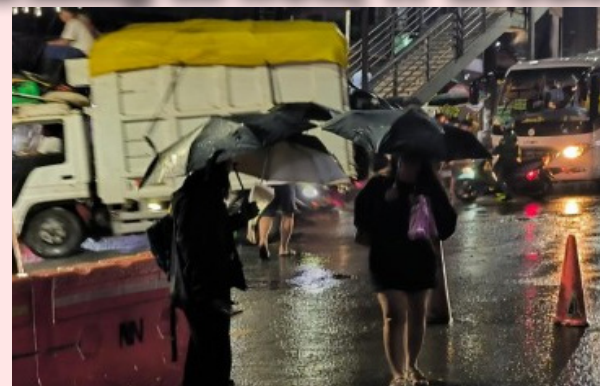

PNP deploys 689 cops, rescues 180 amid habagat rains

MANILA, Philippines — The Philippine National Police (PNP) strengthened its disaster response operations as the southwest monsoon, or habagat, continued to bring heavy rainfall to vulnerable areas on Wednesday.



According to the PNP in a statement, 689 police officers were deployed, with patrol vehicles, buses and trucks providing "Libreng Sakay" services to transport stranded residents.

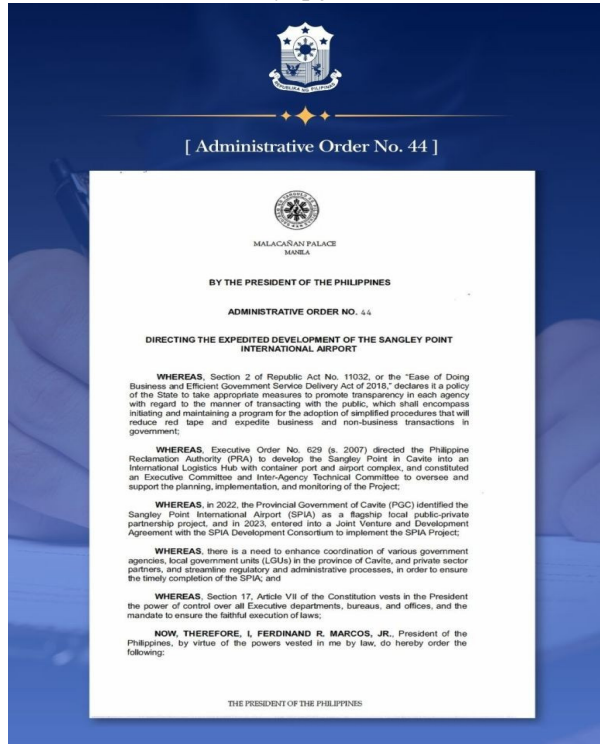
Police units have also rescued 180 individuals and supported 164 relief operations during the sustained rains.

PNP chief Gen. Jose Melencio Nartatez Jr., meanwhile, said the PNP would prioritize personnel and resources in areas requiring the most support, emphasizing that police units remain deployed nationwide to assist affected communities.

Sa ilalim ng Administrative Order (AO) No. 44, iniutos ni Pangulong Marcos ang mas mahigpit na koordinasyon sa pag-

tan ng mga pambansang ahensya ng pamahalaan, ang Provincial Government of Cavite (PGC), at ng mga pribadong sektor na katuwang sa proyekto upang matiyak ang napapanahong pagkumpleto nito.

"There is a need to enhance coordination of various government agencies, local government units (LGUs) in the province of Cavite, and private sector partners, and streamline regulatory and administrative processes, in order to ensure the timely completion of the SPIA," ayon sa AO.

SMC first-half core net income rises 48% as revenue climbs 34%



San Miguel Food and Beverage Inc. (SMFB) posted revenues of P205.3 billion in the first half, up 2%, as growth in its Food business helped offset softer consumer spending and disruptions in some export markets. EBITDA slipped 1% to P38.8 billion, with margins at 19%, while operating income and net income both declined 4% to P28.8 billion and P22.1 billion, respectively. Food revenue rose 5% to P99.3 billion, driven by growth in feeds and sustained demand for branded products, including Magnolia dairy and coffee products, Purefoods Luncheon Meats and Pinoy Favorites, as well as its more affordable product lines. Operating income increased 2% to P8.8 billion, while net income rose 8% to P6.4 billion. Beer revenue declined 1% to P73.7 billion as consumers became more selective with discretionary spending amid inflation and a weaker peso. Domestic beer revenue was steady at P65.9 billion despite softer volumes. International operations posted revenues of US\$128.5 million, lower year-on-year as shipping disruptions in the Middle East affected deliveries to the region. Operating income fell 11% to P14.4 billion, while net income declined 12% to P11.4 billion. Spirits revenue was steady at P32.3 billion as higher prices offset softer volumes. Profitability improved, with operating income rising 8% to P5.4 billion and net income increasing 3% to P4.4 billion.

SMC Infrastructure posted first-half revenues of P20.5 billion, up 3%, even as average daily traffic dipped 1% to 1.07 million vehicles. Elevated fuel prices weighed on road travel demand. Operating income was steady at P11.1 billion, while EBITDA increased 8% to P17.0 billion.

Circular No. 129 on Tuesday night, also covers the provinces of Abra, Benguet, Ilocos Sur, La Union, Pangasinan, Bataan, Bulacan, Nueva Ecija, Pampanga, Tarlac, Zambales, Batangas, Cavite, Laguna, Rizal, Occidental Mindoro and Oriental Mindoro.

The measure was issued upon the recommendation of the National Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Council (NDRRMC) and in view of the heavy rainfall warnings issued by the Philippine Atmospheric, Geophysical and Astronomical Services Administration (PAGASA).

Unless otherwise directed by their respective local chief executives, schools in the affected areas shall implement alternative learning modes for classes at all levels in public and private schools. Government agencies involved in basic and health services, disaster preparedness and response, and other vital services are directed to continue operations and provide necessary services.

Local chief executives may also order the localized cancellation or suspension of classes and work in government offices in other areas, pursuant to existing laws, rules and regulations.

Meanwhile, contract of service and job order workers under alternative work arrangements will continue to receive corresponding wages/salaries, subject to existing rules. Meanwhile, the suspension of work or adoption of alternative work arrangements in private companies and offices remains at the discretion of management. (PNA)

TRECE MARTIRES CITY, Cavite -- Governor Jesus Crispin Remulla declared a state of calamity around 4 p.m. Sunday due to widespread floods in the coastal towns and cities in Cavite.

Remulla has already notified the Sangguniang Panglalawigan (provincial legislative council) which is set to convene Monday to formalize the resolution for the state of calamity declaration.

He stated that Vice Governor Ramon 'Jolo' Revilla will preside over the council session to pass

the resolution on the matter.

Remulla declared suspension of classes in all levels in public and private schools on Monday as the Philippine Atmospheric, Geophysical and Astronomical Services Administration (PAGASA) hoisted an orange rainfall warning in the province due to the southwest monsoon, posing threat of floods to low-lying areas.

Three weather disturbances with local names "Henry", "Inday" and "Josie" have since enhanced the southwest



NLEX, Marilao LGU Team Up to Keep Motorists, Protect Stray Animals

NLEX Corporation and the Local Government Unit (LGU) of Marilao have joined forces with the municipality's Animal Shelter and Care Facility (ASCF) to ensure the humane rescue, care, and management of stray animals found along the expressway corridor.

The agreement was signed by NLEX President and General Manager Luis S. Reñon and Marilao Mayor Atty. Jemina M. Sy.

"This partnership forms a vital part of our overarching advocacy for road safety," said Reñon. "Through the NLEX I Care for Strays program, we reaffirm our commitment to protecting both motorists and animals. The initiative aims to reduce stray-animal-related incidents through responsible rescue operations, proper animal care, and strong collaboration with local government units."

As part of the partnership, NLEX has established the NLEX Animal Rescue Team (ART), a specialized unit tasked with responding to reports of stray animals along the expressway. Team members underwent comprehensive training conducted by the ASCF on proper and humane animal handling and rescue techniques to ensure the safe retrieval and transport of animals to the facility. As an added safety precaution, team members were also provided with the necessary vaccinations to help protect them from potential health risks associated with handling stray animals.

For her part, Marilao Mayor Atty. Jemina M. Sy expressed her appreciation for the joint effort. "We are deeply grateful to NLEX for this initiative. This marks the first time an LGU and NLEX have collaborated to achieve two vital goals: keeping our motorists safe

from the hazards posed by stray animals on high-speed roads and also ensuring the welfare of the animals themselves. This successfully delivers on both," she said.

To support the shelter's operations, NLEX has pledged a monthly donation of animal feed and an ongoing commitment to help monitor the health and welfare of rescued animals. The NLEX I Care for Strays program, launched in 2024, is part of MPTC's broader Mission Road Safety Campaign. The program's initial phase focused on fostering responsible pet ownership in host communities through educational seminars, free anti-rabies vaccinations, deworming, and spay-and-neuter services.

As the program enters its next phase, NLEX Corporation continues to implement proactive engineering and community-based measures to prevent animal intrusion along the highway. These include intensified daily perimeter fence inspections, reinforced drainage culverts, and partnerships with neighboring barangays to champion responsible pet ownership at the grassroots level.

BIR flags 25 Luzon gas stations
in fuel marking drive



MANILA – The Bureau of Internal Revenue (BIR) flagged 25 out of 65 gasoline stations during the first three days of its large-scale fuel marking enforcement drive across Luzon.

In a statement Thursday, BIR said it launched a multi-week fuel marking operation on Aug. 17 to detect possible tax non-compliance by field-testing gasoline, diesel, and kerosene.

Petroleum products that fail field tests are subjected to immediate inventory, sealing or padlocking, and confirmatory testing.

"We are making fuller use of fuel marking and our other enforcement tools to identify revenue leakages, act on them quickly, and protect compliant businesses from unfair competition in the petroleum sector," BIR Commissioner Charlito Martin Mendoza said.

"This is not a one-time operation. We will continue using fuel marking and our other enforcement tools wherever the risk of tax leakage is high, and we will expand these operations to other parts of the country,"

Under the fuel marking enforcement drive, if non-compliance is confirmed, the BIR will assess and collect all applicable taxes and penalties under existing laws and regulations.

Taxpayers can request corrective fuel marking and the lifting of seals once they settle their liabilities and meet all compliance requirements.

The fuel marking operations are further backed by other BIR enforcement and compliance activities, including inventory stock-taking, registration and invoice verification, and Tax Compliance Verification Drives. (PNA)

QUEZON CITY, 12 August 2026 – The Social Security System (SSS) announced today its plan to expand its investment portfolio in foreign markets while continuing to actively participate in the domestic capital markets, as part of its strategy to diversify assets, enhance returns, and strengthen the long-term sustainability of the pension fund.

SSS President and Chief Executive Officer Robert Joseph M. de Claro said the SSS' improved financial position provides greater capacity to pursue investment opportunities while continuing to contribute to nation-building through investments in the domestic market.

"We are very conservative, but at the same time, we are also in a very good position now because of our surplus, that for the first time, we have an opportunity to help in nation-building," de Claro said.

As of 30 June 2026, SSS had ₱1.27 trillion in consolidated investments, distributed across various asset classes in the domestic market. These include ₱629.05 billion in government securities, ₱179.44 billion in equities, ₱154.56 billion in property, ₱151.90 billion in member loans, and ₱96.34 billion in corporate notes and bonds, among others.

The diversified portfolio generated ₱27.16 billion in actual investment income as of 30 June

2026, equivalent to an annualized return on investment of 4.53 percent. The figures exclude realized gains from the sale of equity securities classified as fair value through other comprehensive income (FVTOCI).

SSS remains an active institutional investor in the Philippine capital market through investments in equities, government securities, and other financial instruments allowed under its investment policies. Its exploration of international investments is intended to complement, not replace, its existing domestic investments, providing greater diversification across markets and asset classes.

The planned overseas expansion will allow SSS to explore additional investment opportunities while maintaining its role in supporting the local capital market.

He emphasized that exploring overseas investments does not mean reducing SSS' participation in the Philippine market. Rather, the initiative is intended to complement its existing domestic investments by providing greater diversification across markets and asset classes.

SSS aims to grow its reserve fund to ₱2 trillion by 2030, supporting its capacity to provide meaningful and sustainable social security protection to current and future generations of members and pensioners./ PR

Sa pamilya ng mga ahensya at GOCCS ng DOTr, ang P7.59 bilyong remittance ng MIAA ay sinundan ng Philippine Ports Authority (PPA) na may P5.33 bilyon, ang Civil Aviation Authority of the Philippines (CAAP) na may P1.20 bilyon. ang Clark International Airport

Corporation (CIAC) na may P585.71 milyon, ang Cebu Port Authority (CPA) na may P452.42 milyon, at ang Mactan-Cebu International Airport Authority (MCIAA) na may P129.96 milyon.

Ang pinakamataas na rekord na dibidendo na ipinadala ng mga korporasyong pag-aari at kontrolado ng gobyerno na may kabuuang P147.15 bilyon, ay kinilala noong 2026 GOCC Day kung saan binigyang-diin ni Pangulong Ferdinand R. Marcos Jr. ang mahalagang papel ng mga GOCC sa pag-suporta sa pambansang kaunlaran sa pamamagitan ng maayos na pamamahala sa pananalapi.

Binigyang-diin din ni Kalihim Giovanni Z. Lopez ng Kagawaran ng Transportasyon ang kahalagahan ng mga dibidendo na ipinadala sa pagpapalakas ng posisyon sa pananalapi ng gobyerno at pagpapanatili ng mga prayoridad na programa sa pag-unlad.

Sa ilalim ng Republic Act No. 7656, na kilala rin bilang Dividends Law, ang mga korporasyong pag-aari at kontrolado ng gobyerno ay karaniwang kinakailangang mag-remit ng hindi bababa sa limampung porsyento (50%) ng kanilang taunang netong kita bilang mga dibidendo sa Pamahalaang Pambansa. Mabuhay ang DOTr at MIAA kabilang na ang lahat ng mga ahensyan nasa ilalim ng DOTr!!! Mabuhay tayong kahat mga katoto!!! - Pasky Natividad

Marcos admin warns companies of their obligations under Extended Producer Responsibility Act of 2022

Expressing strong commitment to curb plastic pollution, the Marcos administration is stepping up efforts by enforcing plastic recovery obligations of large companies, including issuing show-cause letters to firms that may be failing to comply with the Extended Producer Responsibility (EPR) Act, a Palace official said Thursday.

During a visit to a Pasay City pumping station Thursday morning, President Ferdinand R. Marcos Jr. cited the garbage problem as a contributor to clogging at pumping stations.

In a Palace press briefing, Presidential Communications Office (PCO) Undersecretary and Palace Press Officer Claire Castro read a statement from the Department of Environment and Natural Resources (DENR) saying, "Aktibong binabantayan ng DENR ang pagsunod ng mga kumpanya sa EPR Law sa pamamagitan ng pag-audit sa kanilang recovery rates upang matiyak ang compliance."

"Ang ahensiya ay nag-issue ng 155 show cause letters sa mga potential obliged enterprises na hindi tumutupad sa kanilang EPR obligations,"

Castro added, noting the EPR Act serves as a carrot-and-stick mechanism to producers for the recovery and recycling of their plastic packaging wastes.

The EPR Act, or Republic Act No. 11898, requires large enterprises in the Philippines to recover and divert a growing percentage of their plastic packaging waste.

The law amended the Ecological Solid Waste Management Act of 2000.

Enacted to curb plastic pollution, it mandates audited annual recovery targets managed through individual programs or collective organizations.

Records show companies comply with and even surpass set targets, said Castro, citing a 2024 record showing audited

recovery rates reached 59.98 percent for rigid plastics and 56.33 percent for flexible plastics, which is high relative to the legal target of 40 percent.

"So, kung ang kumpanya ay tumutupad sa kanilang mga alituntunin at kanilang obligasyon, makikiusap tayo sa ating mga kababayan, mga residente, na tumulong tayo," she said, appealing to the public.

For 2024, the target is 40 percent; 60 percent for 2026; and 80 percent for 2028, Castro said, warning that non-compliant entities will be penalized. "Sa mga kumpanyang hindi makaka-recover ng kanilang plastic waste, footprint o hindi makasunod sa mga requirement ng batas ay nahaharap sa mga multi-million-peso na multa," she added. | PND

DSWD's KALAHI-CIDSS boosts disaster resilience of poor communities

MANILA – The implementation of the Kapit-Bisig Laban sa Kahirapan – Comprehensive and Integrated Delivery of Social Services (KALAHI-CIDSS) has made significant strides that encourage disaster preparedness and mitigation among vulnerable communities, a Department of Social Welfare and Development (DSWD) official said on Friday.

"Using the community-driven development (CDD) strategy, the DSWD continues to carry out programs that strengthen the resilience of poor communities and help mitigate the impact of disasters and calamities," Assistant Secretary Irene Dumlaog said in a news release.

"The CDD approach encourages communities in geographically-isolated and disadvantaged areas (GIDA) and hard-to-reach barangays to actively participate in solving the main concerns of their communities. By allowing them to design, implement, and manage solutions to their priority problems, we are empowering communities to accept ownership of their own development," Dumlaog said.

The DSWD official made the remarks

amid the ongoing multiple weather systems that hit most parts of the country where KALAHI-CIDSS' subprojects exist.

From 2023 to 2025, a total of 2,032 KALAHI-CIDSS subprojects related to disaster resilience and mitigation were completed with 621,675 household-beneficiaries across all the regions in the country, except the National Capital Region (NCR).

The completed CDD sub-projects include 131 evacuation centers; 1,595 flood control/river control/drainage; and 306 riprap wall/slope protection/erosion control.

In Barangay Cambas-ac, Dapa, Surigao del Norte, one of the finished KALAHI-CIDSS sub-projects identified by their community members was the repair of the sea wall, which was damaged at the height of Typhoon Odette in 2021.

The restoration of the sea wall with a budgetary requirement of PHP3,067,250 was completed in the first half of September 2024 benefiting 272 families in 195 households.

The newly-repaired sea wall serves as a protective barrier against coastal hazards, offering enhanced safety and a greater sense of security by shielding the area from storm surges and powerful waves.

In Mimaropa, community members from Aborlan and Narra in Palawan province were able to seek refuge during the effects of a shearline last February, thanks to the evacuation centers that were built under the KALAHI-CIDSS program.

A similar evacuation

center project in Lubuagan, a 4th-class municipality in Kalinga province, has also helped the townsfolk from nine barangays to have a safe haven during heavy downpours and landslides.

The Mines and Geosciences Bureau (MGB) has a list of identified areas susceptible to landslides released in 2021.

Among the 32 barangays listed in Kalinga were the municipalities of Balbalan, Pasil, Rizal, Pinukpuk, Tinglayan, and Lubuagan. Barangay Upper Uma in Lubuagan is deemed as vulnerable to high landslide incident.

With this knowledge, the community lost no time in proposing for the construction of a safe and adequate evacuation center when personnel of the KALAHI-CIDSS came into their municipality.

Through the bayanihan of more than 200 volunteers, the construction of the evacuation center began in January 2024 and was completed in July of the same year and is now the villagers' safe haven during calamities.

Next year, the KALAHI-CIDSS will pave the way for a new community resiliency development project dubbed "Panahon ng Pagkilos: Philippine Community Resilience Project (PCRP)", according to Dumlaog.

"The PCRP will prioritize municipalities with the highest poverty incidence, targeting economic vulnerabilities and environmental threats such as drought, extreme heat, flooding, and landslides. It will also address child health, nutrition, and inclusive support for Indigenous Peoples," she said. (PNA)
